Canterbury Christ Church University's sites in Canterbury

The University has four main sites in Canterbury – the North Holmes Campus, Augustine House, Hall Place Enterprise Centre and the new Christ Church Sports Centre – as well as several smaller sites and accommodation facilities around the city. All University sites are marked with red blocks on the map of Canterbury in this guide.

North Holmes Campus

The campus map in this guide is of the North Holmes Campus, the University's largest site. This campus is five minutes' walk from Canterbury city centre and the Cathedral. Pedestrians arriving from the city centre should access the campus via the St Augustine's entrance just off Lady Wootton's Green. Pedestrians may also access the campus via any of the gates on North Holmes Road or via the Old Sessions House entrance on Longport. The University's main reception is in Old Sessions House.

Please note that parking close to and onsite at the North Holmes Campus is at a premium. A visitor's permit for onsite parking may be available by prior arrangement. You are strongly recommended to use one of the city's park and ride services or a city centre pay and display car park and then walk to the campus (see "Arriving in Canterbury by road" section overleaf).

Cycle racks are available onsite.

For visitors wishing to drive to the campus, there are signposts from the city centre. The main reception in Old Sessions House can be approached from St George's Place / New Dover Road and then on to Lower Chantry Lane and along Longport. Alternatively, the campus can be approached from the ring road (A28) along Lady Wootton's Green, Monastery Street, Havelock Street and then on to North Holmes Road.

For drivers with satellite navigation, the postcode for main reception and Old Sessions House is CT1 1PL.

Augustine House

Augustine House will provide a state-of-the-art library and student services centre. Under one roof, the new building will be a single port of call for all student enquiries from booking accommodation to financial advice and support.

Located on the city centre's ring road, the building will also provide flexible learning spaces as well as conference and exhibition space for the University.

Hall Place Enterprise Centre

Hall Place Enterprise Centre is just outside Canterbury on the A2050, near the village of Harbledown. It can be accessed by car or taxi from the city centre or other University sites. There is limited onsite parking by prior arrangement. You are advised not to walk from the city centre due to the lack of pavement along part of the route.

Travelling to Canterbury

Arriving in Canterbury by road

There are a number of pay and display car parks in the city centre and there are three park and ride services – see city centre map. The park and ride buses drop passengers at the bus station in the city centre, which is 10 minutes' walk to both the North Holmes Campus and Augustine House. The Wincheap park and ride service is recommended for those travelling from the London direction and the New Dover Road service is recommended for those travelling from the Dover and Folkestone area. The Sturry Road service, which is recommended for those travelling from Heme Bay and the Thanet area, also drops passengers on Broad Street, which is nearer the North Holmes Campus than the bus station. 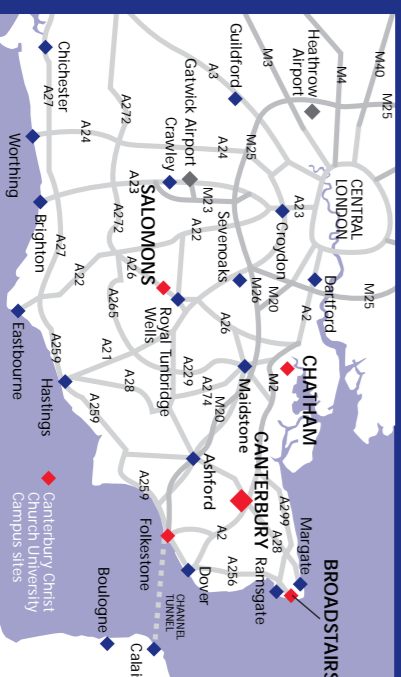
The Canterbury ring road is busy during the morning and evening rush hour period and you are advised to allow extra time for your journey if travelling at these times. Depending on where you park, both the North Holmes Campus and Augustine House are 5 to 15 minutes' walk from city centre car parks.

The city has an extensive network of cycle paths and the North Holmes Campus is signposted on the closest paths.

Arriving in Canterbury by rail

Canterbury can be reached from London Victoria, Charing Cross and Waterloo East stations. The fast service takes one hour and 20 minutes. There are two railway stations in Canterbury – East and West. Both are approximately 20 minutes' walk from the North Holmes Campus.

Augustine House is five minutes' walk from Canterbury East and 20 minutes' walk from Canterbury West. There are taxi ranks at both stations. **Arriving in Canterbury by coach or bus** There are frequent coaches between London Victoria and Canterbury. The journey time is approximately one hour and 45 minutes. Coaches stop at Canterbury bus station which is 10 minutes' walk from both the North Holmes Campus and Augustine House. Buses connect Canterbury to neighbouring towns and many villages.
