Keynote Speaker – Professor Tanya Byron



Professor Tanya Byron is a chartered clinical psychologist and has worked clinically for twenty years. She is a Professor in the Public Understanding of Science, has an honorary doctorate from the University of York and is Chancellor of Edge Hill University.

Professor Tanya Byron was commissioned by the Prime Minister of the previous Labour Government to lead a review on the risks to children from exposure to potentially harmful or inappropriate material on the internet and in video games.

As a clinician, journalist, author and broadcaster, Professor Byron works with and writes about a variety of psychological and emotional issues as well as mental health difficulties that affect people of all ages. She has been presenter and on screen expert/therapist for many BBC programmes including Little Angels, Teen Angels, and The House of Tiny Tearaways.

Professor Byron is the patron of PROSPEX a charity based in a very deprived area of North London, the aim of which is to support the young people in all aspects of their lives and empower these young people to realise their own true capability and worth in the world.

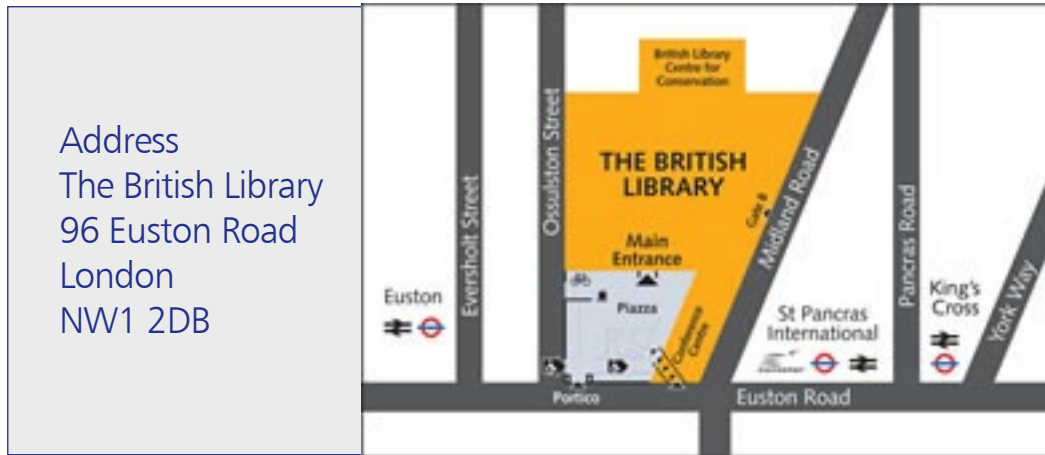

Getting here

The British Library is at 96 Euston Road next to King's Cross and St Pancras International stations, which are served by National Rail, First Capital Connect and London Underground. You can also use the Hammersmith and City, Piccadilly, Northern, Circle, District, Metropolitan and Victoria Underground Lines. Many bus services stop on Midland Road and Euston Road.



By train
