Our History

[Our University started out as a teacher-training college in the 1960s](#) in response to a national shortage of teachers. Today, we continue to shape our courses and research around critical social issues nationally and globally.

Since 1995, we have had the right to use 'university' in our name. Using the word '[university](#)' [has protection in law](#). A provider must have Office for Students (OfS) approval to use the word 'university' in its name.

In 2005, the Privy Council awarded us the full university title of Canterbury Christ Church University. We installed the Archbishop of Canterbury as Chancellor.

Since 2009, we have had research [degree awarding powers](#).

In 2022, we celebrated our Diamond Jubilee, marking 60 years of making a positive difference in people's lives through education, research, and innovation.

Office for Students

Canterbury Christ Church University is [registered](#) with the [Office for Students](#) (OfS). Our OfS registration number is 10001143.

We must meet requirements in areas that include the quality and standards of its courses, equality of opportunity for students, financial sustainability and good governance.

We can charge eligible students fees up to the [higher statutory fee limit](#). We can charge fees on undergraduate courses up to the higher statutory fee limit amount, depending on our quality rating and fee limits forming part of our access and participation plan.

We took part in the OfS [Teaching Excellence and Student Outcomes Framework](#) (TEF) 2023. A provider taking part in the TEF is awarded a gold, silver, bronze or provisional rating. We have a [silver](#) rating.
