COURSE REQUIREMENTS

2. Throughout the course, students must maintain access to a relevant employment setting. Students who are unable to maintain such access will be required to interrupt or withdraw with any relevant default exit award or credit.

CONDITIONS OF REGISTRATION

3. All students on this course are qualified registrants adhering to professional codes of practice, therefore
 - (i) Students must remain in good standing in relation to fitness to practise.

INDIVIDUAL MODULES

4. A student may register for no more than two individual modules without registering for an award-bearing course. The student must meet any prerequisites for the particular module.
5. Where a student successfully completes an individual module, the credits will be awarded and a University transcript issued as evidence.

RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING

6. Recognition of Prior Learning is limited to a maximum of 60 credits.
7. Students entering the course with RPL of 60 credits will not be eligible for the award of BSc Healthcare Practice [ordinary degree].
8. Where students are transferring credit which has been accrued within the previous five years from the University of Brighton, University of Greenwich, Portsmouth University or the University of Surrey the mark awarded will appear on their transcript.

HURDLES

9. All components of assessment must be passed.

COMPENSATION

10. Compensation is not permitted.

MAXIMUM PERIOD OF REGISTRATION

11. Registration on the course/route is for a maximum of three years for full-time students and a maximum period of six years for part-time students from the date of the initial registration, including interruptions, reassessments and extensions.

FITNESS TO PRACTISE

12. The employer's disciplinary or Fitness to Practise procedures will apply to students on this course.
13. The University Fitness to Practise procedure may also apply on this course. Where a student is subject to a Fitness to Practise referral, continuation on the course, and engagement with current and future assessment or retrieval opportunities related to professional practice will only be possible:
 - (i) where the Fitness to Practise procedure deems this to be appropriate and
 - (ii) where any precautionary measures linked to practice are lifted.
