INTRODUCTION

1. The Regulations for Taught Awards apply in full to this course, except as detailed in these Additional Course Regulations. In any conflict between the two, this document shall take precedence.
2. The University Certificate in Non-Medical Prescribing may be taken at level 6 or at Level 7. These Additional Course Regulations cover the course at both levels.
3. The Level 7 Non-Medical Prescribing course may also be delivered as part of the Advanced Clinical Practitioner integrated degree apprenticeship containing MSc Advanced Clinical Practice with Non-Medical Prescribing or the MSc Advanced Clinical Practice without Non-Medical Prescribing. These courses have their own Additional Course Regulations that should be read alongside these Additional Course Regulations.

PROTECTED AWARD

4. The following awards confer eligibility to apply for professional registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Council and the Health and Care Professions Council:
 - (i) the University Certificate in Non-Medical Prescribing L7
 - (ii) University Certificate in Independent and supplementary prescribing L7
 - (iii) University Certificate in Non-Medical Prescribing L6
5. Students must meet all academic and professional requirements in order to pass the course.
6. Aegrotat awards do not provide eligibility to apply for admission to the relevant professional register.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

7. Throughout the course, students must maintain access to clinical supervision in a relevant professional setting. Students who are unable to maintain such access will be required to interrupt or withdraw.

CONDITIONS OF REGISTRATION

8. Students must remain in good standing in relation to fitness to practise.

ASSESSMENT

9. Students must pass all assessments.
10. The pass mark for the Pharmacology Examination is 80%.
11. The pass mark for the Numeracy examination is 100%.

FITNESS TO PRACTISE

12. The employer's disciplinary or Fitness to Practise procedures will apply to students on this course.
13. The University Fitness to Practise procedure may also apply on this course. Where a student is subject to a Fitness to Practise referral, continuation on the course, and engagement with current and future assessment or retrieval opportunities related to professional practice will only be possible:
 - (i) where the Fitness to Practise investigation deems this to be appropriate and
 - (ii) where any precautionary measures linked to practice are lifted.
