2. This award is made under the degree awarding powers of the University, as part of a Consortium to deliver the course.

AWARD CLASSIFICATION

3. A Board of Examiners may recommend that a student is awarded a Graduate Diploma:
 - (i) with Distinction; OR
 - (ii) with Merit; OR

- (iii) with a Pass.
4. To qualify for the Graduate Diploma a student must complete satisfactorily the requirements of the award on which they are registered, taking into account the Special Regulations applicable.
 5. For the purposes of classification marks are rounded at the module level:
 - a student achieving 69.5% in a module rounds up to 70%;
 - a student achieving 69.4% rounds down to 69%.
 6. The classification arrangements are as follows:
 - (i) Fail - any mark below 39.5%
 - (ii) Pass - any mark between 39.5% and 59.49%
 - (iii) Merit - any mark between 59.5% and 69.49%
 - (iv) Distinction - any mark over 69.5% and over
 7. The classification will be derived from the average mark of the modules.
