INTRODUCTION

1. The Regulations for Taught Awards apply in full to this course, except as detailed in these Additional Course Regulations. In any conflict between the two, this document shall take precedence.

PROTECTED AWARD

2. The only award for this course that confers eligibility to apply for professional registration with the Health & Care Professions Council (HCPC) and the Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists is MSc Speech and Language Therapy (Pre-Registration). Students must meet all academic and professional requirements, including those related to student conduct, good health and good character, to qualify for this award.
3. Aegrotat awards do not provide eligibility to apply for registration with the relevant professional register.
4. Students who are unable to meet all the academic and professional requirements may be eligible for Alternative Awards as set out in the approved course documentation. These awards do not confer eligibility to apply for registration with the HCPC or for professional registration with the Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists.

CONDITIONS OF REGISTRATION

5. Students must make a formal declaration of good health and good character at the beginning of each year of the course.
6. Students must remain in good standing in relation to fitness to practice.

HURDLES

7. All components of assessment must be passed.

COMPENSATION

8. Compensation is not permitted.

RETRIEVAL OF PRACTICE LEARNING

9. Where reattendance on placement/professional practice is required, one further attempt will be granted
- (i) Where there is an approved action plan to address the issues raised on the previous attempt at placement/practice
 - (ii) Where a suitable placement/practice setting is available.
10. Reattendance on placement can occur in the same year as the first attempt.

MAXIMUM DURATION OF STUDY

11. The maximum duration of study is four years.

FITNESS TO PRACTISE

12. The University Fitness to Practise procedure applies on this course. Where a student is subject to a Fitness to Practise referral, continuation on the course, and engagement with current and future assessment and retrieval opportunities related to professional practice will only be possible:
- (i) where the Fitness to Practise process deems this to be appropriate and
 - (ii) where any precautionary measures linked to practice are lifted.
