### Legal framework

Our Articles Of Association set out our legal framework.

Our University started as a teacher training college in the 1960s to respond to a national shortage of teachers. Today, we continue to shape our courses and research around critical social issues nationally and globally. You can read about our <u>history</u>.

Inspired by our Church of England foundation, the University's mission is to pursue excellence in higher education set out in our <u>mission and values</u>.

#### Office for Students

Canterbury Christ Church University is <u>registered</u> with the <u>Office for Students</u> (OfS), and our OfS registration number is 10001143.

We must meet requirements in areas that include the quality and standards of its courses, equality of opportunity for students, financial sustainability and good governance.

We can charge eligible students fees up to the <u>higher statutory fee limit</u>. We can charge fees on undergraduate courses up to the higher statutory fee limit amount, depending on our quality rating and fee limits forming part of our access and participation plan.

We participated in the OfS <u>Teaching Excellence and Student Outcomes Framework</u> (TEF). A provider participating in the TEF is awarded a gold, silver, bronze or provisional rating. We have a <u>silver</u> rating.

Since 1995, we have had the right to use 'university' in our name. The use of the word 'university' has protection in law. A provider must have OfS approval to use the word 'university' in its name.

Since 2009, we have had research degree awarding powers.

# How the University is organised

Our leadership comprises the Chancellor, the Governing Body, the Vice-Chancellor and the Senior Management Team.

Together, they provide governance and accountability for the University.

Subject to the overall responsibilities of the Governing Body and Vice-Chancellor, the Academic Board is responsible for all aspects of the University's academic work. It establishes committees and sub-committees to help it with its work.
