University Bookshop


Check out the window of the University Bookshop for themed books and environmental handprints made at previous Craftivism events.

11:30 – 2:30pm, Touchdown


Visit the Greenpeace pop-up stand at Touchdown to learn more about the environment, the climate crisis, and the cost of fossil fuels.

A paper and an art installation on the emotions of protest by XR activists, showing various protest and policing activities, and segments of text from interviews with activists.


After the seminar, you will be able to view the artwork until 21 November in the Daphne Oram café.




