BACKGROUND

Aptus Outdoor Ltd approached the Engineering faculty at Canterbury Christ Church University for support with an innovation investigation, having identified the need for the development of a new product.

ACTION/ BENEFITS

A meeting was set up to discuss how the business challenge could be approached and how the University could support them with finding a solution. It was recommended by a senior lecturer, that a student, who had completed a materials module, would be well equipped to undertake the project as a three-month summer internship, with academic oversight.

Unitemps met with the business and colleagues to explore how the University could offer a complete solution. The parameters of the project were set, and Unitemps worked with the faculty to recruit a qualified student.
