As a World Heritage Site, Canterbury is one of the country's 'must see' destinations. You'll be studying right at the heart of this great student city, with its historic streets, ancient city walls, cosy pubs, exciting clubs and top-class restaurants. And, of course, you'll be within walking distance of one of the most beautiful cathedrals in the world.



The Medway Campus is close to the historic naval town of Chatham and Rochester, with its beautiful cathedral. The campus itself is in an area known as Chatham Maritime, where major developments have created a student-friendly quarter with a real village atmosphere. Here you'll find a multiplex cinema, a shopping centre and a fully equipped sports centre. London is under an hour away by train.



Our Salomons Institute for Applied Psychology is in Tonbridge Wells, known as Royal Tunbridge Wells it is one of a few towns and boroughs in England to officially be given a royal title. Situated in an area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, it sits amid rolling hills, ancient woods and open heaths. With fantastic new buildings, facilities and courses, our city campus is transforming.






Counselling, mental health & wellbeing






We make time in the academic year for you to take part in personal development activities including placements, employer mentoring, workshops and business networking events.











































Sport and active health are exciting parts of the Christ Church experience. The University's multi-million-pound Sports Centre has the latest fitness equipment and offers affordable gym and recreational sport memberships, a full range of fitness classes, and a personal training service. We also provide a range of free programmes including Couch to 5k, a running club and outdoor boot camp classes in partnership with Our Parks to help you stay active and healthy.

At Christ Church you will find a wide range of club sports on offer; many of our teams regularly compete in the British Universities and Colleges Sports leagues and a variety of other competitions, including the annual Varsity event.

You'll also have access to our joint specialist facility, Polo Farm Sports Club. Just a short distance from the Canterbury Campus, the facilities include three floodlit hockey pitches, an indoor tennis centre, outdoor tennis courts and a spacious new sports hall, specialising in netball, hockey and cricket. The University has five grass sports pitches for football and rugby, and through partnership with local clubs we offer golf, kayaking, equestrian, trampoline and athletics facilities.











































No matter what you study at Christ Church, there are lots of ways to get involved in the cultural life of the University. Students can go to free lunchtime concerts with world-renowned musicians in St Gregory's Centre for Music, or stop by the evening gigs and open mics in St George's Centre. There are exhibitions throughout the year in the Daphne Oram Gallery, and screenings, talks, and events across our campuses.

Canterbury hosts cultural events and exhibitions year round at the Marlowe Theatre, Canterbury Cathedral, and Canterbury Museums. Medway has vibrant festivals throughout the year and incredible museums including the Chatham Historic Dockyard.






































ACCOMMODATION





Postgraduate study

You can choose from a range of taught and research postgraduate degrees, ranging from Certificates and Diplomas to Masters courses and PhD degrees by thesis, portfolio and publication.

By Research

What qualifications do I need?

We accept a range of qualifications from all over the world. If you want to have a look at entry requirements and qualifications we accept from your country, visit:

Can I apply late?

Yes, we accept applications throughout the year and will discuss with you your next enrolment opportunity.

If I apply, when will you reply?

We aim to review all applications within 24 hours. We will be in touch with you if we need any further documents or if we require you to submit a portfolio/attend an interview. If you have everything ready and send us all the required documents with your initial application, you could have a place with us the next day!

























HOW TO APPLY

How do I apply?

If you are interested in an undergraduate course, you can apply via UCAS (Universities and Colleges Admissions Service), directly to the University or via our in-country representatives.

If you are interested in a postgraduate course, for the majority of courses you will be asked to apply directly to the University.

Applying via UCAS

The UCAS application process is the main tool used to apply for a place on an undergraduate degree at a UK university.

It is a straightforward process – all you need is our Institution Code, which is C10, alongside the course code you are interested in studying. You can find the UCAS course code on each course page within our website. Once you have that, all you need to do is fill in the form including your qualifications, or expected qualifications, personal statement, and contact details for a referee. There is a fee involved for all applications via UCAS.

Applying direct to Christ Church

We are more than happy if you decide to apply directly to our university. The direct application process is very similar to the UCAS process, just that you will be in direct contact with us from day one. We will ask you to complete an online form, information we will need is the same as you would need to input on UCAS. It is free if you apply directly through us.
