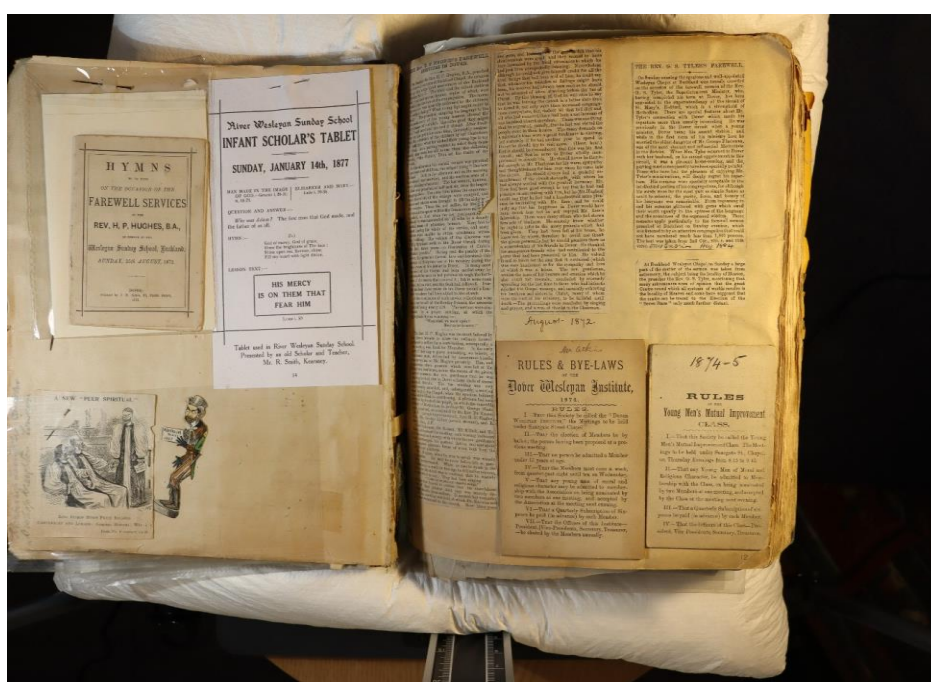


# DOVER WESLEYAN METHODIST SCRAPBOOK

# Inventory of the Dover Wesleyan Methodist Scrapbook

## History of the Scrapbook

The Scrapbook was compiled by William Debenham Atkins (1847-1928). It was lost for some years until it was rediscovered in 2014 in the vestry of one of the remaining Methodist Churches in the Dover and Deal Methodist Circuit. Items of memorabilia were collected from members of the Methodist Circuit from 1934-2014, and these accompany the collection.

## Custodial History

In April 2022, the Scrapbook was donated to the Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Education at Canterbury Christ Church University by Harvey Richardson. Further accruals are not expected.

## Extent

One scrapbook, one maroon ring binder, loose items itemised below and one clear Perspex ring binder containing accompanying documentation about the history of the Dover Methodists.

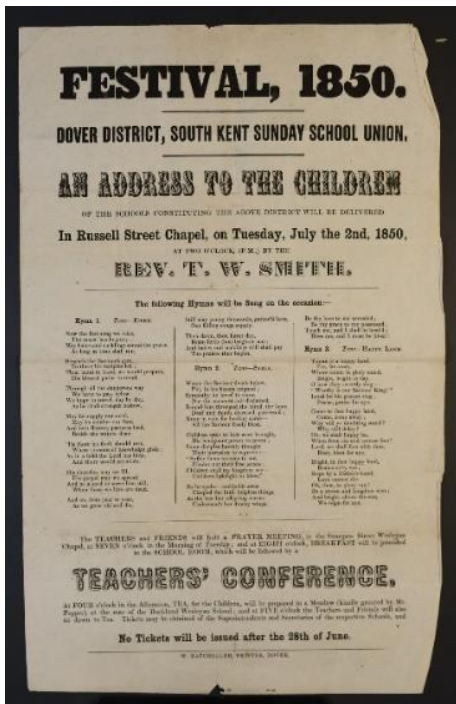

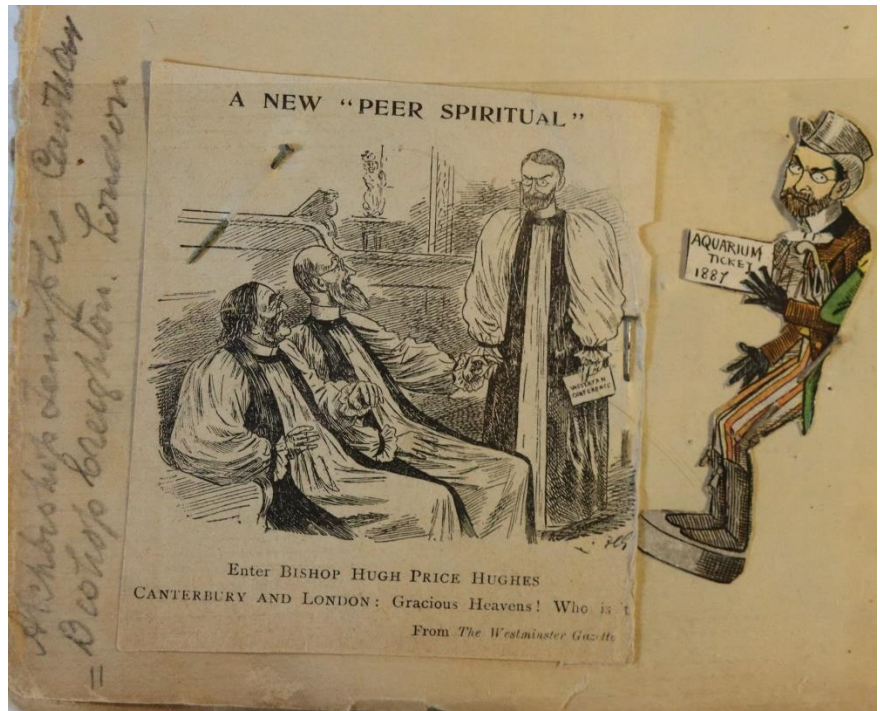

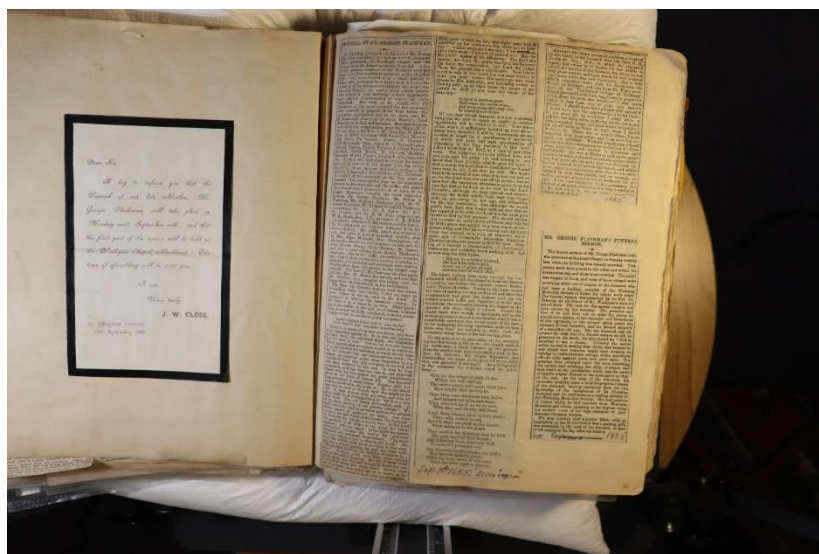

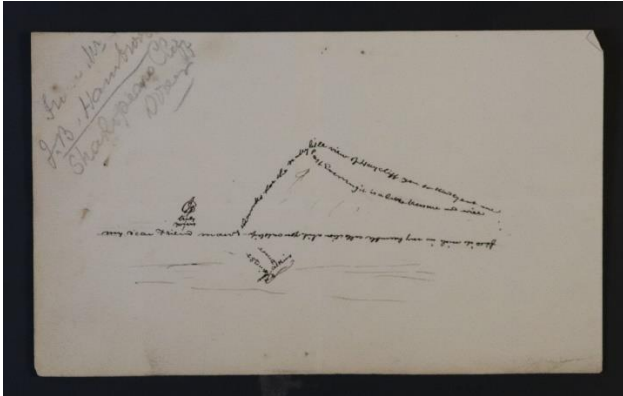

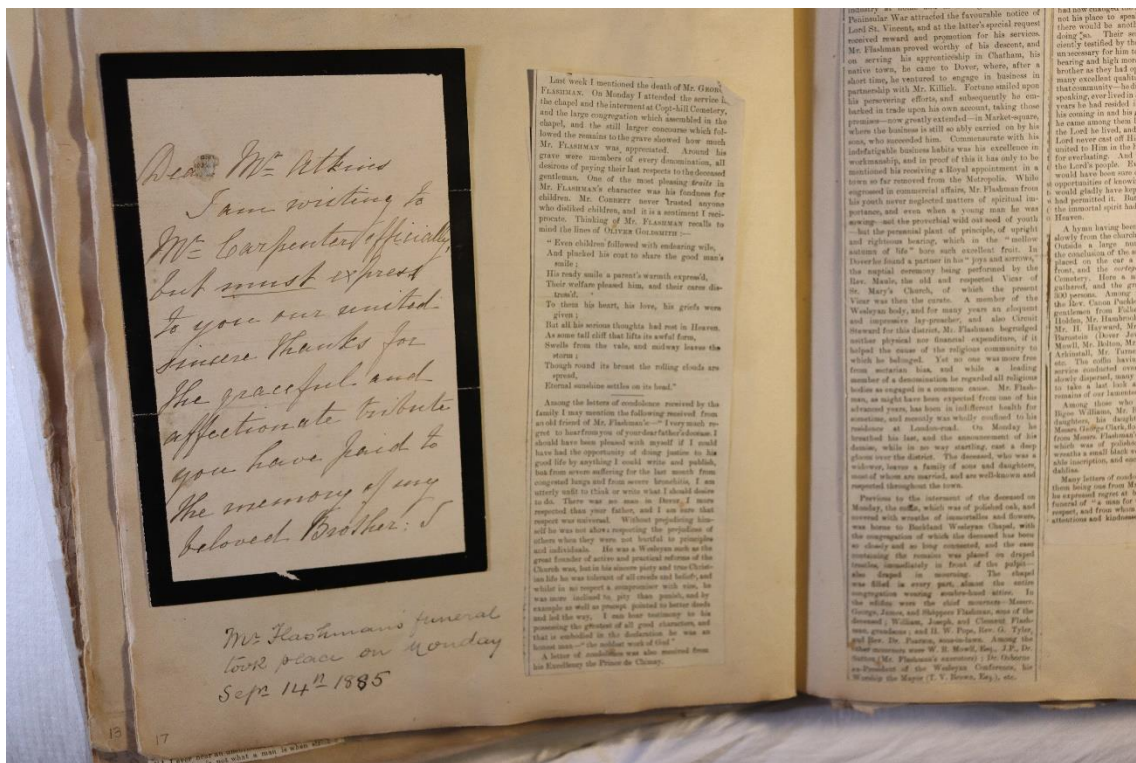
