



Important information for applicants: teaching and learning 2021/22 academic year

Your experience as a postgraduate research student is at the heart of our planning. We want to provide you with a high-quality education and student experience. It is also vital we ensure the health, safety and wellbeing of our whole University community.

We plan to deliver our postgraduate researcher development training programme and other activities predominantly online during the next academic year. In addition, there will be some in-person campus-based training on weekdays and, occasionally, at weekends.

While planning to open our campuses and facilities in September 2021 fully, we must be mindful of other possibilities should the UK government and health guidance change. Should restrictions be implemented, we may need to adjust what we offer and our on-campus activity (including training and social activities). We will tell you about the changes and how they affect your study.

We published your 2021/22 course information in early March 2020. Changes have since been made. We ask you to re-read your course details to make an informed choice about whether the course remains suitable for you.

When you register for your course, you will be asked to confirm that you have read about our changes and agree to them. It means that by choosing to continue with your application and register with us, you accept these changes and are happy to study your course with us.
