

INTRODUCTION TO REASSESSMENT WITH ATTENDANCE

WHAT IS REASSESSMENT WITH ATTENDANCE?

Reassessment with attendance is a formal offer of a Board of Examiners (for more information about Boards of Examiners please see [Your Guide to Undergraduate Assessments and Awards](#)). It provides you with a further attempt at completing and passing assessment activities at your current level. With reassessment with attendance you are required to undertake the reassessment by attending (in the following academic year) those modules you have not yet passed and completing only those assessments you have not yet passed. While doing reassessment with attendance you cannot progress to the next level.

WHY WOULD I BE OFFERED REASSESSMENT WITH ATTENDANCE?

Reassessment with attendance has been designed to provide you with the necessary learning and support to complete your studies.

If you have not passed your assessment after your initial attempt, you will be offered either reassessment (which for most programmes occurs in the summer) or reassessment with attendance. The offer depends on how many credits you have passed. The following table sets out, under what conditions a student will be offered reassessment.

	Students who pass at least 60 credits at the first attempt at a level	Students who do not pass at least 60 credits at the first attempt at a level
When does reassessment take place?	Reassessment will take place in July.	Reassessment will take place in the next academic year.
What does the reassessment involve?	Where a student has not passed a module, they will be required to undertake reassessment for only the assessment activities that have not been passed.	This will be reassessment with attendance. This means that before they can progress to the next level, students will be required to attend the modules that have not been passed and undertake reassessment for only the assessment activities that have not been passed.
What happens if a student does not pass a first reassessment attempt?	<p>A second reassessment attempt will be offered providing the student has attended/submitted a first reassessment:</p> <p>Students who do not qualify for trail and progress will not be permitted to progress to the next level of study and will be required to undertake reassessment with attendance in the following year. They will be required to attend the modules that have not been passed and undertake reassessment for only the assessment activities that have not been passed.</p> <p>Students who do qualify for trail and progress will progress to the next level. They will be required to:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Undertake reassessment for assessment activities that have not been passed <p style="text-align: center;">and</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Commence the next level of study and meet all the expected requirements such as attending modules, undertaking assessment, etc... 	<p>A second reassessment attempt will be offered to students who do not pass up to 120 credits, providing they have attended / submitted a first reassessment.</p> <p>This reassessment will be in July.</p>

WHAT ASSESSMENT WILL I DO WHEN TAKING REASSESSMENT WITH ATTENDANCE?

It is important that you talk to your programme team as soon as possible to review your assessment for the coming year and plan your work. Reassessment will only be for the assessment activities you have not yet passed on modules which have not been passed. In most cases you will be entitled to submit the same piece of work in an improved form rather than having to undertake a new piece of work. There are some exceptions such as where the assessment takes the format of an exam or where the work cannot be submitted in an improved form (such as group work).

In some cases, the module being delivered will have changed from the previous year. You will normally be undertaking your reassessment based on the previous assessments and weightings, not any new arrangements. It is important you discuss your assessment details with a member of your programme team.

WILL REASSESSMENT WITH ATTENDANCE BE CAPPED?

Yes. Reassessment is capped at assessment activity level (40%) which means that depending on your other marks for the module, you could achieve an overall module mark above the pass mark.

WHAT ARE THE ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS?

In your year of Reassessment with Attendance you will only be enrolled on the modules that you have not yet passed. You will be expected to attend those modules again in full and to submit your assessments by the deadlines set for the module. WILL I BE CHARGED FOR REASSESSMENT WITH ATTENDANCE?

You will be charged a reduced module fee for any modules you undertake as Reassessment with Attendance. HOW WILL REASSESSMENT WITH ATTENDANCE AFFECT MY STUDENT FUNDING?

However many modules you are studying, Reassessment with Attendance is treated as taking a year of study.

All eligible students can have tuition fee support for the standard length of your Higher Education course plus one additional year, if needed. The standard entitlement will, with exceptions, be reduced if you have studied on a previous Higher Education course. Whenever you study on a Higher Education course, regardless of how many modules or units you study, this will be classed as a year of study and will count towards your entitlement. Therefore reassessment with attendance would count towards your entitlement.

Each student is individually assessed by Student Finance England, based on their circumstances. It is recommended you contact them directly to explain the changes to your study and clarify what support you would be eligible for and would have available. Their contact details are:



WHAT HAPPENS IF I DO NOT PASS ALL MY MODULES DURING REASSESSMENT WITH ATTENDANCE?

All students have two reassessment attempts. Whether you have any further reassessment attempts available, will depend on what reassessment you have undertaken previously.

- A student who took their first reassessment attempt in the summer reassessment period is undertaking their second (and final) reassessment attempt under reassessment with attendance. In that instance, there would be no further assessment attempts available for any modules not passed.
- A student who has taken their first reassessment attempt as reassessment with attendance will have one final reassessment attempt available during the following summer for any assessments not yet passed.

Note: Please see the following diagram for how this works in practice.



REASSESSMENT WITH ATTENDANCE IN BRIEF

The offer of *reassessment with attendance* is a 'rules-based' decision that is set through the University Regulation and Credit Framework.

Reassessment with attendance provides you with a reassessment attempt in which you will re-attend the module in the following year and only complete the outstanding reassessment(s).

While doing *reassessment with attendance* you cannot progress to the next level.

You can only undertake reassessment based on what you have been offered and cannot opt for a different timing (e.g., if you are offered *reassessment with attendance* you cannot request to undertake summer reassessment instead).

For *reassessment with attendance*, you are expected to attend the modules you have not passed in order to support the necessary learning to successfully pass your assessment.

You will be undertaking reassessment only on the components you have not yet passed in any outstanding modules.
